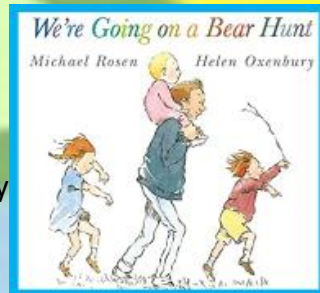
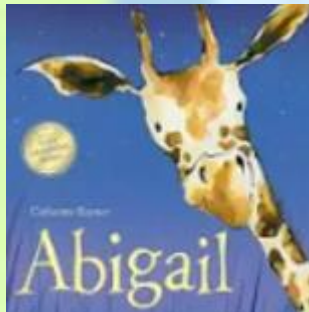
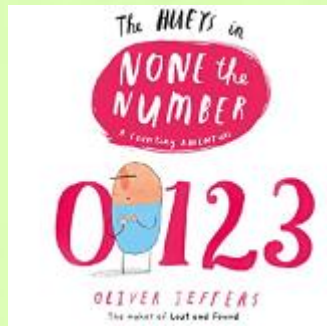


Coln Reading River—Autumn

This classic repetitive story encourages children to join in with storytelling and repeated phrases. It helps develop language, sequencing skills and an understanding of story structure.

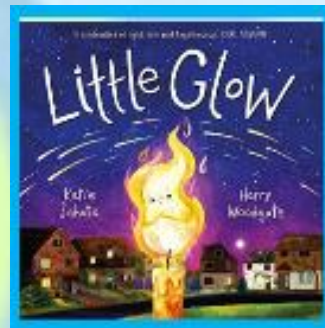


Children will think about how friendships can change and learn the importance of kindness, cooperation and including others.

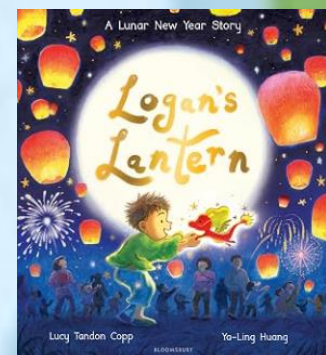
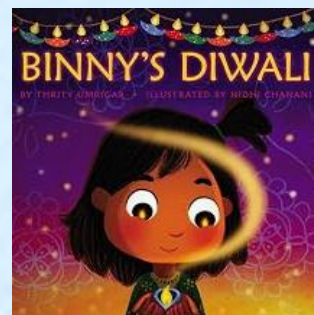
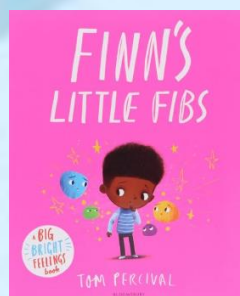
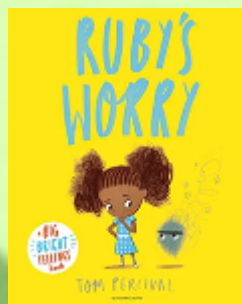
